Dependent Children

- Jurisdiction for guardianship proceedings for a child in a dependency action – residence or county with jurisdiction of dependency case.
- Court can receive GAL reports and notice GAL

Florida ABLE

- Last year we discussed a 1 year change for recovery of Medicaid services against ABLE accounts.
- "Section 11 of chapter 2018-10, Laws of Florida, is repealed."
- ABLE Accounts will flip to probate estates and standard estate recovery laws apply.

- Retroactive Medicaid
 - Until last year 90 days from application date, provided eligible
 - Last year was supposed to be 30 days, but was only made to first of month of application
 - SB 192 which would have made this permanent failed.....

- Retroactive Medicaid
 - They kicked the can for another year.

SB 2502 extended for another year:

Senate Bill 2502/Enrolled

Chapter 409.904, Florida Statutes. Optional payments for eligible persons.—

The agency may make payments for medical assistance and related services on behalf of the following persons who are determined to be eligible subject to the income, assets, and categorical eligibility tests set forth in federal and state law. Payment on behalf of these Medicaid eligible persons is subject to the availability of moneys and any limitations established by the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216.

- (12) Effective July 1, 2019, the agency shall make payments to Medicaid-covered services:
- (a) For eligible children and pregnant women, retroactive for a period of no more than 90 days before the month in which an application for Medicaid is submitted.
- (b) For eligible nonpregnant adults, retroactive to the first day of the month in which an application for Medicaid is submitted.

This subsection expires July 1, 2020.

- The third time was the charm
- WOW

- HB 409
- 78 Page Bill
- Third year proposed
- Combined electronic notarization with estate planning

Can electronically (not on paper but in a digital format) execute legal documents (deeds, wills, trusts, powers of attorney, HCS, Living will)... AND...

The Notary and Witnesses can appear remotely (not in the room) via audio-video technology. Think Face Time, Skype, Zoom, etc..... WOW.

Elder Law Section had LOTS of problems with this.

Opposed the first 2 years. Ended up supporting this Bill.

- Removed Vulnerable Adults
- Removed some powers under a DPOA
- Recording of process
- Clerks can be Custodians

- Specific questions to identify a vulnerable adult
- A warning must be read
- Other questions to test capacity

- Technology requirements set by Dept. of State
- Insurance coverage
- If video cannot be produced treat like lost will

- Still a lot to do with rulemaking by State
- Effective Jan 1, 2020
